# MEd Educational Leadership: Post-Secondary & Student Affairs Surrey, BC (Fall 2012 - Summer 2014)

The Faculty of Education **MEd** program is designed for **current post-secondary professionals and student services professionals.**

## ELIGIBILITY

- Applicants must meet SFU masters admissions requirements. A bachelor's degree demonstrating strong academic performance is expected. Minimum 3.0 CGPA.
- Non-traditional applicants may also be considered. These applicants may have followed an alternate educational path and have extensive experience in an educational or professional setting.
- Candidates require several years of exemplary and varied professional experience, particularly in the areas of post-secondary administration, leadership, or student services.



## PROGRAM FORMAT

This program extends over six terms, beginning in Fall 2012 and concluding in Summer 2014.

Classes meet at the Surrey campus every second weekend on Friday evening and Saturday.

## PROGRAM FEATURES

This Master of Education (MEd) degree is grounded in research, theory, and practice related to the field of Higher Education and Student Affairs. It focuses on the study of higher education, with special emphasis on student affairs and services leadership in various postsecondary educational settings. Where appropriate, the Association for the Study of Higher Education (ASHE) Leadership Program Guidelines and Council for the Advancement of Standards in Higher Education (CAS) are applied to the program design and coursework.

The degree program consists of six courses and a culminating comprehensive examination.
