

	<p>MASTER OF EDUCATION DEGREE Curriculum and Instruction: Imagination and Cultural Inclusion FALL 2010 – SUMMER 2012 Prince Rupert, BC</p>
Program Outline:	<p>This program leads to the Master of Education (MEd) degree and is intended primarily for teachers and other educators working in settings with significant numbers of Aboriginal/First Nations students (both K-12 and adult). The program is offered in the context of a long-term partnership between School District 52, the district Aboriginal Education Council, and the SFU Faculty of Education. It is grounded in research, theory, and practice stemming from the LUCID Project, a research collaboration that has focused on building imaginative, culturally inclusive approaches to teaching the mainstream curriculum in Prince Rupert and other districts. The program will expand participants’ repertoires of principles and strategies for engaging all students in learning, and will provide a framework for collaborative, participatory action research that aims to benefit northern schools, districts, and the communities that they serve.</p>
Program Description:	<p>This program extends over six semesters, beginning in Fall 2010 and concluding in Summer 2012. The Master of Education degree in Curriculum and Instruction is awarded following the completion of a series of seven courses and a culminating Comprehensive Examination.</p>
Format:	<p>During the Fall and Spring Semesters (September - December and January - April) classes will typically be held every second weekend at a venue in Prince Rupert. During the Summer semester in 2011, students will take two courses: one course in May and June, in Prince Rupert, and the second over three weeks in July at the SFU Burnaby campus. In Summer 2012, the final course and comprehensive examination will be held in Prince Rupert.</p>

It consists of a paper and an oral presentation.</p> <p>(The outline may be subject to change)</p>
EDUC 811-5	<p>Fieldwork I This course is a frame in which students develop a project related to their program. This may be an action research project, an organizational analysis, a new curriculum, or other project related to their coursework and their own practice. This project will be a part of the final Comprehensive Exam Project.</p>
EDUC 816-5	<p>Developing Educational Programs and Practices for Diverse Educational Settings Students investigate theories and issues associated with developing educational programs and practices in various educational contexts, with a focus on the development of new programs and their implementation in schools and other educational settings.</p>

EDUC 820-5	Current Issues in Curriculum and Pedagogy This wide-ranging course focuses on educational issues, trends and practices which impact teaching and learning in schools and other educational settings, including community-based, nature-based and place-based approaches to education.												
EDUC 822-5	Evaluation of Educational Programs Students look at processes used in program evaluation; including assessments and other measurement devices; and political, social and philosophical issues relating to the evaluation of educational programs.												
EDUC 823-5	Curriculum and Instruction in an Individual Teaching Specialty An intensive examination of developments in a curriculum area selected by the student. In addition the course will deal with major philosophical and historical factors that influence the present state and future directions of curriculum and instruction.												
EDUC 830-5	Implementation of Educational Programs Students in the course look at problems and practices associated with innovation and implementation including the nature of change in the educational context, the roles of teachers, administrators, change agents, and evaluators.												
EDUC 879-5	Lev Vygotsky's Theories in Education Covers all major aspects of Lev Vygotsky's cultural-historical activity theory of human development and its contemporary applications in education. Concepts include the zone of proximal development of higher psychological functions, language and consciousness, interfunctional relations, analysis according to units, and "tool-and-result" methodology.
