<p><b>Program Description:</b></p>	<p>This program is intended for educators interested in First Nations education, broadly speaking who wish to examine critically a range of theoretical perspectives on issues of equity and practical concerns that impinge on the quality of education in general and curriculum and pedagogy specifically. While this program is grounded in curriculum core courses, it provides options to permit students to take courses relevant to their interests and professional goals, within a limited range of options.</p> <p>Delivery will take into account the professional and personal commitments of students. For example, we anticipate the possibility of intense weekend sessions monthly and intense course delivery in the summer. Instructors will be lecturers and faculty.</p>
<p><b>Program Requirements:</b></p>	<p>Degree(s): MEd (Course work/Comprehensive examination); MA (Thesis) The MEd route consists of 35 credit hours of course work plus a comprehensive exam (Educ 883). The MA route which, may be an option for some cohort members determined in consultation with the site coordinator, consists of 25 credit hours of course work (although students are not limited to these hours) plus a thesis.</p>
<p><b>MA/MEd Core Requirements:</b></p>	<p>MEd Students will complete four core courses from the core requirements listed below. MA Students will complete three core courses from core requirements listed below, plus a methods course (EDUC 867 or 864) and one elective.</p>
<p><b>Format:</b></p>	<p>During the Fall Semester (September-December) and Spring Semester (January-April), classes will be held every second weekend in your community. During the Summer Semester, students will take two courses at the main SFU Burnaby Campus. We believe the cohort model to be a major strength toward program success. For this reason, we ask students to fully commit themselves to the two-year program offered.</p>
